Freshman Ag student Chad Cassidy said, "We all had a good time and the camp was really nice."

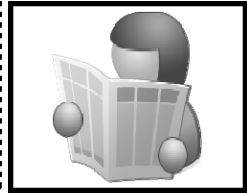
Greenhand Camp is not a required trip, but Chad recommends it for next year's class.

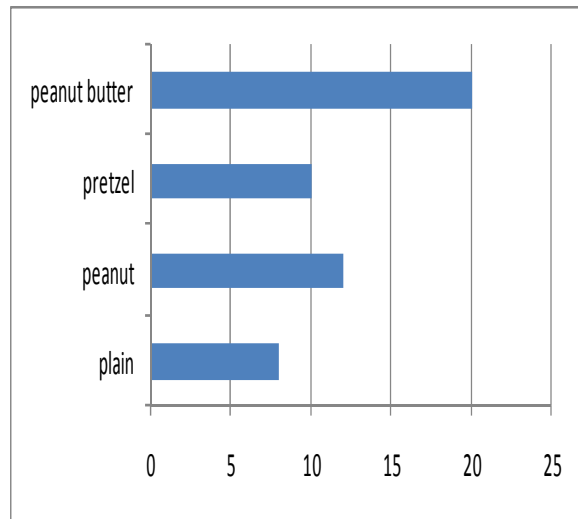
# What is your favorite M&M?

With over 10 different types of M&M's I chose the top four to be part of this poll. They included plain, peanut butter, pretzel and peanut.

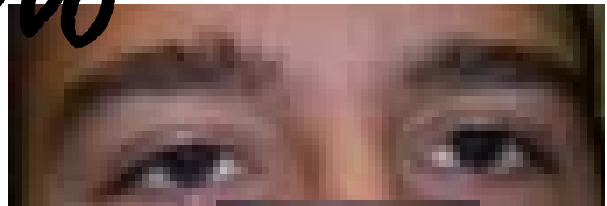

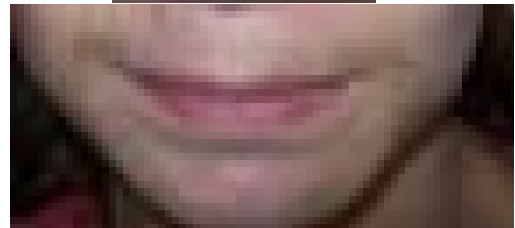
