10. Potato Chips- The world's favorite snack for any activity at any time.



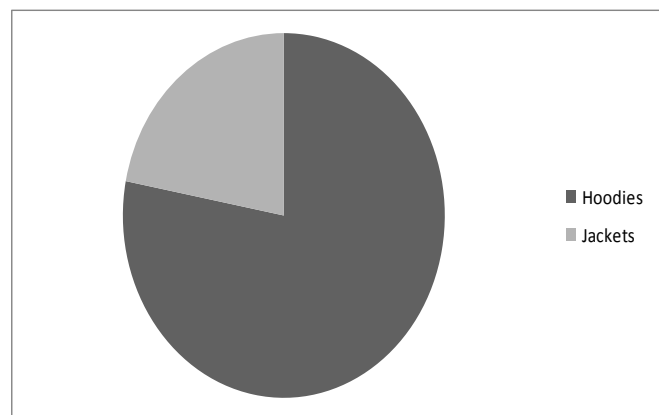
# Do you prefer Hoodies or Jackets?

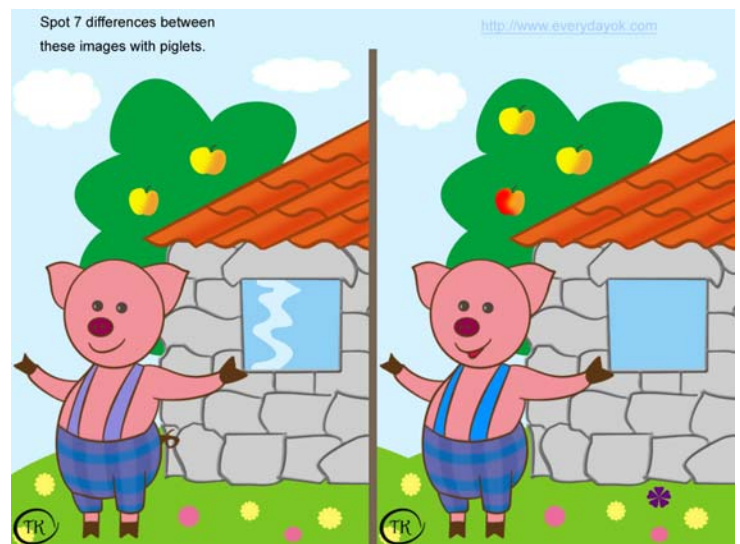


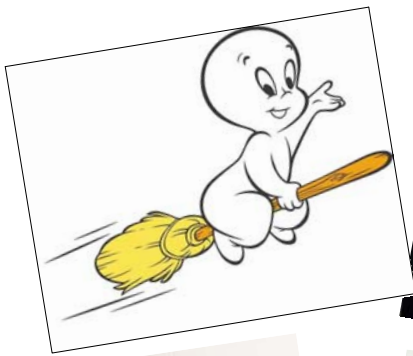
