Don't forget to attend the Sixth Annual State of the Schools Meeting which will be held on **April 26, 2011 at 7:30 pm** in the Business Lab room 207. At this meeting Mrs. Jane Schalk and I will present information regarding the progress of the school both financially and academically. We hope that you will attend this informative meeting. On Monday March 14, Gov. John Kasich released the Blue Book outline of his biennial budget proposal for FY 2012/FY 2013. It contains total line-items amounts for education programs, but no details are available that show district-by-district amounts. One thing is clear, the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act money, or as it is often referred, the stimulus money will not be replaced in the budget. The loss of this money alone will result in a 7% cut to the New Riegel school budget. Additionally, there will be approximately a one half reduction in replacement dollars for the loss of the local tangible personal property tax of which we received \$55,255 in FY10.

As more details surrounding the budget become available we will keep you informed. Please note that we are committed to remaining a fiscally responsible school district. As always if you have questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me.

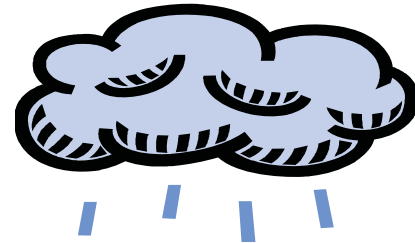

This is an untimed, computerized test designed to assess basic skills in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. It is a requirement for the tech-prep programs. I have spent 5 weeks working with 32 New Riegel 5th graders on exercise and nutrition. They were each given a pedometer and asked to keep a log of the number of steps they walked each day. Logs were collected weekly. They AMAZED me by walking a total 3,965 miles in those 5 weeks. In classroom education we covered use and care of the pedometers, portion control, light, moderate and vigorous activities. Limiting screen time (TV, Computer games, and non-educational time on the computer). We discussed the food and nutrition pyramids, serving size, calorie levels, food math, and where's the fat? We also learned to read nutrition labels for serving size, calorie content, fat content, nutritional value and many other things. The students earned stickers, magnets and bookmarks and were treated to a tasting party of nontraditional fruits and vegetables and flexible fliers. This was all made possible through an Ohio Department of Health, Child and Family Health Services Grant to the Seneca County General Health District.

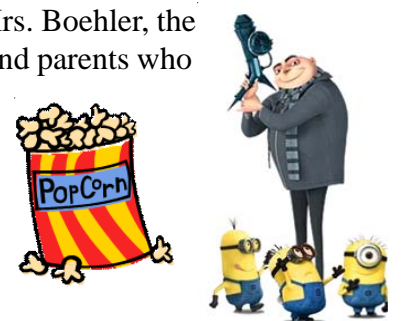

New Riegel FFA members Jeremy Borer and Josh Gerschutz placed 1st in the district Agriculture Industrial Diagnostics Career Development Event. They advanced to the state level hosted by the University of Northwestern Ohio (UNOH) where they competed for top honors and thousands of dollars in scholarships against teams from all over Ohio. Thursday, March 10, 2011 they were treated to a banquet held at UNOH. After the meal there was a short program followed by a tour of the facilities at UNOH. Friday, March 11, 2011 they competed and placed 11th in the State.

Every year there is a day where the freshman receive their Greenhand degree. The Greenhand degree is the first degree an FFA member can earn and is a first step to the American FFA degree, the highest honor one can achieve in our organization. In order to receive your Greenhand degree, you must have learned and explained the FFA creed and the FFA motto, the FFA mission, and have explained the FFA emblem. This year the recipients were: Jacob Dryfuse, Lance Smith, Brandon Brodman, Spencer Hemminger, Jarrett Mullholand, Fred Clark, Jeremy Borer and Floyd Bouillon, Nathan Bowman, Kyle Weaver, and C.J.Tiell.

New Riegel students visited the Federal Reserve bank in Cleveland on March 8th, 2011. The bank is the headquarters of the US Federal Reserve system for the 4th district. While there, we learned about how the Fed operates, a brief history of its formation, and how they help to keep the economy stable. We were able to observe their new 3 story vault and how the money was handled and sorted. We also were able to explore the original vault and examine the tools used to construct and maintain it.

In February, we celebrated the National FFA Week with a tractor parade, petting zoo, coloring contest, and pedal pull. The National FFA Week was celebrated February 19th-26th. This week is used for the FFA members to have a chance to educate the public about agriculture and the FFA. A great time was had by all.

Six FFA members recently spent some time with Mrs. Stevens's class learning about chemical change and conducting an experiment to observe chemical change. Meghan Welly, Ally Burns, Codey Colebank, John Scherger, Jennifer Fitch, and Josh Gerschutz had a great time working with the 4th graders. These students also had a lot of fun building and demonstrating a simple machines lab with the third Graders. They had a giant lever to lift a heavy object, inclined planes to reduce the force needed to move an object up, They had races with deck screws to show how inclined planes worked as well. There was also a station with weights and pulleys, and one with Wedges. The Pedal pull sled was a fun station with a plethora of examples as well. Check with your friendly local third grader to see what they have learned.

District Ag Mechanics CDE was March 22nd, 2011 at Sentinel. In this CDE, students are given a chance to show their skills in different areas of common agricultural mechanics applications. These include SMAW and MIG welding, oxy-fuel metal working skills, tap and die, wiring, precision measuring, sweating pipe, hydraulic part identification, and tool and fastener identification. District Small Engines CDE is April, 5 2011 at Sentinel In this CDE, students get to troubleshoot small engines under 20 HP, identify different engine parts and tools, as well as lubricants, and perform an inspection on a piece of outdoor power equipment, such as a lawnmower or chainsaw. 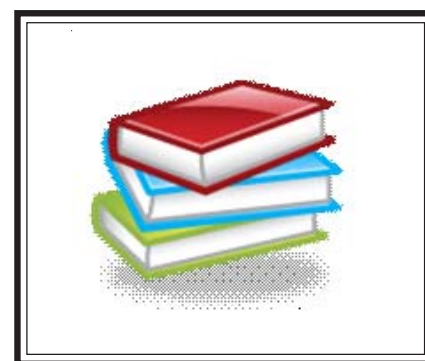



A Note from the School Nurse...

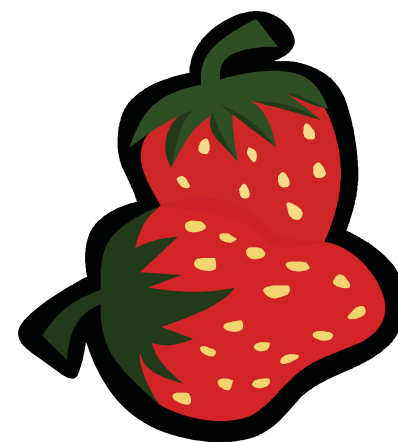
Did You Know?

I have been working with 5th graders the past several weeks talking about fitness and nutrition. Did you know that the 1% Chocolate milk they are served has 170 calories in 8 ounces with 20 of those calories coming from fat? It also contains 27 grams of sugar and 30% of the recommended daily intake of calcium. The 2% milk they are served has only 130 calories with 45 of those coming from fat. It has 12 grams of sugar and 30% of the recommended daily intake of calcium. Did you know that ½ cup of vanilla ice cream has 140 calories with 70 of those coming from fat? It contains 15 grams of sugar and only 10% of the recommended daily intake of calcium. Did you know that 6 oz. of Fruit-flavored yogurt contains 170 calories but only 15 of those calories come from fat? The yogurt contains 30 grams of sugar and contains 20% of the recommended daily intake of calcium

We need to teach our children to be savvy consumers, to read labels and make healthy choices. They need to learn that 30- 60 minutes of daily exercise is important. They also need to decrease the amount of time in front of a screen—be it computer games or television if they are to have longer life expectancies than their parents.

Strawberry and Spinach Salad

- 2 bunches spinach, rinsed and torn into bite-size pieces
- 4 cups sliced strawberries
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/4 cup white wine vinegar
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 tablespoon poppy seeds




Directions

1. In a large bowl, toss together the spinach and strawberries.
2. In a medium bowl, whisk together the oil, vinegar, sugar, paprika, sesame seeds, and poppy seeds. Pour over the spinach and strawberries, and toss to coat.
