The State Report Cards have been released and you may access ours on our website at www.newriegelschools.org

We are pleased to announce that New Riegel achieved an **Excellent** rating again this year on the Report Card. This year we met 26 of 26 indicators to be rated Excellent.

The performance index score reflects the achievement of every student. It is a weighted score with the greatest weight being given to students who achieve at the advanced level.

The chart below indicates our District's achievement in this area:

We also improved in our value-added measure exceeding expected growth in fourth grade reading and seventh grade math and meeting expected growth in fifth, sixth and seventh grade reading and fourth, fifth, sixth and eighth grade math. The value-added measure represents the progress our district has made with its students since last school year. Our overall composite measure for the district was **met expected growth**.

Adequate yearly progress is a goal that is set for reading and math proficiency and participation, attendance rate, and graduation rate. These goals are applied to ten student groups. In order to be reported a district must have at least 30 students in a group. Of the ten groups we have at least 30 students in three groups: all students, white and students with disabilities. This year we met AYP in all areas.

We are truly blessed at New Riegel to have supportive parents who send their students to us ready to learn.

For the fourth year, we are able to reduce student fees by 20% due to organizational contributions and the cost saving measures we have taken. Our fees are calculated on the actual costs of the consumable materials used by our students. This year that reduction amounts to a \$17.00 savings per child for families with students in the elementary grades. High school students' fee reduction amounts vary by student depending on the classes they are taking.

As stated last month, Mrs. Darlene Mack will be resigning her position as a Board of Education Member in December. Each teacher has worked hard towards the goal of increasing the communication and information to our families. Please take a look at my blog as well. Did you know we have 96 different Parent Resource Kits for you to use with your child at home? You can check them out at any time. Please talk to your child's teacher to see what is available to you.

Our focus in the elementary this year will be taking a look at the new Core Curriculum set out by the Ohio Department of Education and developing grade level curriculum maps to align ourselves with the most current practices in teaching and learning. Another focus will be reviewing best practices in our guided reading so your child will be assessed and taught what he or she needs in the areas of reading fluency, vocabulary development and comprehension. Individual reports will be available to you during conferences to review reading strengths and weaknesses.

TESTING

Fall OAA: All third graders will be taking the Fall OAA Reading test on Wednesday, October 5th.

PSAT: All juniors are strongly encouraged to take the PSAT. This is a test designed to help students prepare for college entrance exams. The cost is \$14 per student. The test will be given Wednesday, October 12th from 8-11 in the library. Students can begin signing up on September 26th. Juniors who take PSAT are eligible for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Explore Test: All eighth graders will take the Explore Test on Thursday, October 20th. This is a test designed for junior high students as a precursor to the Plan Test sophomores take and the ACT taken by juniors and seniors. This test has a career and interest inventory portion that can be very helpful to students and parents.

Fall OGT: The Fall Ohio Graduation Tests will be October 24th – 28th. This week is for any juniors or seniors who have not taken or have not passed one or more sections of the OGT. These tests will be held in the morning. The order of the tests is: reading, mathematics, writing, science, social studies.

ACT: ACT dates are posted in the hallway and on my bulletin board. Registration information is available outside of my office. If you are eligible for the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch program, you can take the ACT for free with a fee waiver. Please see me for more information.

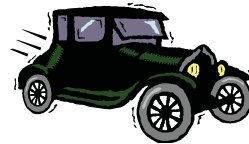
Student Council/ SADD Halloween Parade

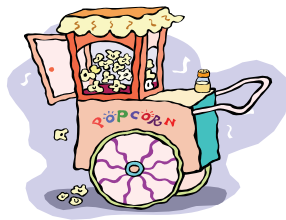
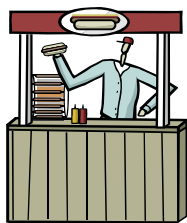

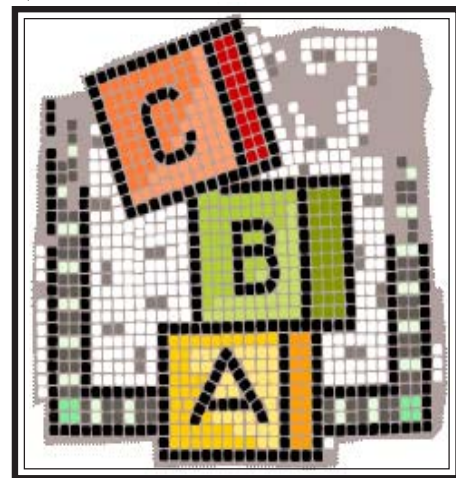

Grade 4 Heritage Day


