The school year is under way and as you read this we will have already completed six days of school.

You may begin to see some construction out near the ball fields. The New Riegel Athletic Boosters and the school are building a new concession stand. The old concession stand was to the point where it needed major repairs. The new concession stand will have running water and restroom facilities in it. THANK YOU ATHLETIC BOOSTERS for your great contribution in this project.

This year we are starting the year with 428 students enrolled in grades PK-12. Our kindergarten class has 39 students currently enrolled, while our senior class has 37 students enrolled in it. Our smallest class is grade three with 16 students enrolled.

Our teaching staff includes two preschool teachers employed by the North Central Ohio Educational Service Center, 12 elementary (K-6) teachers, two part time Title I teachers, eight high school (7-12) teachers, two of which are part time, three special education teachers, and six teachers who teach subjects to students in grades K-12, one of which is part time.

Our support staff includes administrative, cafeteria, fiscal, maintenance and transportation. There are 16 of those staff members.

New Riegel Community,

To start the 2011-2012 school year, I would like to let you know about my new website Mr. Rombach @ New Riegel Schools. The site this year will be updated on a regular basis on the great and important things occurring at New Riegel Schools. You'll have a chance to comment on the topics as well as this is intended to be a blog for everyone to see.

I wanted to review the elementary grade card marking system. As has been communicated last year and in earlier newsletters grades 1-6 will be implementing a new standards based report card.

Student learning will be communicated through the following marks:

4 = Exemplary: consistently meets and extends the topic

3 = Proficient: meets criteria and expectations of the topic

2 = Developing: develops understanding of the indicator with practice and support

1 = Novice: experiences difficulty and requires consistent practice and support with the topic. May not be developmentally ready for these topics

Blank box = not assessed at this time

Using the old marking system of A, B, C, D, F you the parent only saw the end result of the culmination of all grades that were taken throughout the nine weeks. So, at the end of the nine week period you saw Math – A or Reading – F, but really what does that tell you about what your child learned throughout the nine week period?

Under the new system when you logon to Progress book you will see the indicator or skill as the description for a particular assignment/assessment along with any additional information which would describe it. For example, if your child is working on rounding 2 digit decimals, they will be assessed on the work completed and a mark of 4, 3, 2, or 1 will be placed under that particular learning goal/indicator. If your child receives a 4 or 3 you should feel confident that your child clearly understands how to round two digit decimals, if they receive a 2 or 1 you should recognize that your child is still struggling with the concept and your child's teacher will continue to work with your student on that concept.

Each of these indicators or skills will be reflected in progress book under one of the subject's standards. For example, the six math standards are number/number sense, measurement, geometry, patterns and algebra, data analysis and mathematical processes. You will be able to see the particular indicator or skill your child is working on categorized under one of the six standards in math. You will see a similar reflection of learning under the reading and writing standards.

It is our goal to provide you the parent with as much information about the concepts your student is learning in math, reading and writing as possible so that together we can ensure that every child is able to grasp the concepts required for that grade and be fully prepared to move on to the next grade with no gaps in their learning.

One question parents often ask in regards to the standards based grade card is:

*I am used to my child accumulating points to determine a grade. How is it determined whether my child receives a 4, 3, 2, or 1?

- a. Your student's teacher will assess their learning on the skill they are addressing. A homework assignment, a quiz, an in class project or some other type of assessment could be used to determine whether a student has mastered that particular indicator/skill or is in need of additional assistance. Keep in mind that each student's mark on one of the particular standards in math, reading or writing will be the average of multiple assignments/assessments.

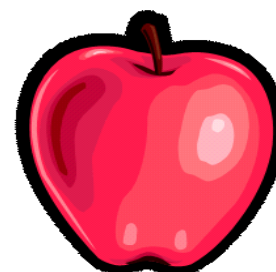
I hope that this information helps you understand our new standards based reporting process better. Please logon to Progress Book, look at your child's assignments/assessments and if you have questions or concerns please contact me.

Again our goal is to provide you, the parent, with as much information as possible about the concepts your child is learning to ensure success for your student.

PSEO Students:

All PSEO students need to have schedules turned in to me as soon as possible. If you are planning on substituting a course to count for high school graduation credit you must fill out a Credit Substitution Form. Each course must be approved by Mr. Rombach before the beginning of the semester. If you are trying to substitute for a year long or 1 credit hour NR course you have to take 2 PSEO courses. For example, if you are taking English 101 at Heidelberg to substitute for LA 12, you have to take a second English course spring semester. One 3 credit hour college course equals 0.6 of high school credit. If you do not take the second course you will not have enough credits to graduate. Remember, you are only allowed to attend ONE college this year. The state changed the rules for PSEO and you are no longer allowed to attend multiple colleges through PSEO funding. If you have any questions please stop by, email, or call.

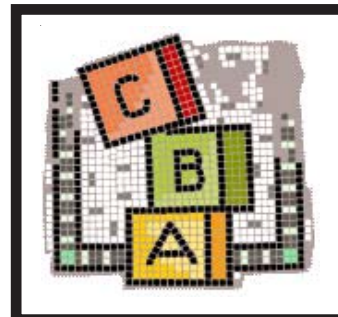

The officers set their goals for this year one of which is to have at least 75% of all members attend each of the meetings. Also discussed was the budget for the year and trips that are to be taken throughout the year such as the National FFA Convention and the National Machinery Show held in Louisville, KY. Finally, we discussed possible t-shirt designs presented by our President, Allison Burns. We are planning a family picnic again this year with a date and time to be announced. After the business meeting the officers and their parents enjoyed a relaxing BBQ and Smores before heading home.

Incoming freshmen can attend Greenhand Camp. This camp is designed for freshmen and 1st year FFA members. Campers learn about agriculture and the FFA while experiencing the great opportunities offered by FFA Camp Muskingum. While at camp, they can enjoy a friendly advisor-camper basketball game, volleyball, canoeing, fishing, leadership development activities, games in adventure valley, and a dance on the last night. Campers also can practice their marksmanship at the rifle and shotgun ranges, where many first-time shooters are given a short lesson in gun safety and several free shells to practice, after which they can purchase additional ammunition to practice their skills. New Riegel FFA members have attended this camp for the past four years and have enjoyed the trip immensely. The dates for this year's camp are September 25-27, 2011.

We have many activities planned this fall and would like to invite all parents and students to become involved and take advantage of as many opportunities as possible. In September, seven students will have the opportunity to attend the annual Colt Conference in Columbus, Ohio where they will receive some leadership training and experiences to bring back and share with the chapter. We will also be participating in the Urban and Rural Soils Career development events although the County dates and location are to be announced. We will once again be selling quality Florida citrus as our annual fundraiser. Sales start October 14th. The upper class men will be looking forward to attending the largest exhibition of Agricultural product and practices at the Annual Farm Science Review in London, Ohio. The sophomores will have the opportunity to attend a Career Day at the Miller Conservation Farm Sponsored by the Soil and Water Conservation District. Every student should have at least one SAEP (Supervised Agriculture Experience Project) each year. This is an opportunity to study an area of interest more in depth. Project areas include Animal or Plant Entrepreneurship, Job Placement, Research, Home or Community Improvement, or Small Business. Our project year runs from January 1st to December 30th of each year. These records are also required for Greenhand, Chapter, State, and American Degree. The top one half of one percent of all FFA members will earn their American Degree what a goal to strive for! To earn these degrees, I recommend one home improvement project and any combination of 2 other options each year. While this may sound complicated, many of you are already doing the work at home, and just need to start documenting it. Having visited most of your homes, I think it is safe to say that all of you should be able to achieve your state degree by the time you graduate and most could earn your American Degree one year later.
